**Mones says...**

By the time you receive the notice-sheet with this week's 'Mones says', members of our choir will be 30 minutes into leading the morning worship service at St Luke's Anglican Church in Haifa.

What a privilege to be able to do this. We will be singing hymns and sharing testimonies of Jesus' work in our lives. The team members will have been learning Arabic on the flight!

It is wonderful that the whole of our pilgrimage to the Holy Land is starting by connecting with one of our local sister churches in the land. It is an opportunity to build relationships with other followers of Jesus, to be encouraged and to encourage others.

This is mission, this is ministry, and this is fellowship. Paul writes that we should be mutually encouraged, as to give and receive at the same time builds up our muscles of faith.

After our morning service today we will be going up Mount Carmel to Elijah's cave and then to the town of Ptolemais (Acts 21:7), the modern city of Akko, or St. Jean d'Acre [as it was known during the Crusades.] Then on to our last site, the village of Birem, one of the destroyed and annexed Christian Villages on the border with Lebanon.

The rest of our time in the Holy Land will provide us with opportunities to visit most of the Biblical sites associated with Jesus, worshipping and having communion in a couple of places along the route. In addition, the Choir will be performing at two other locations: The Nazareth Hospital in Nazareth and St George's Cathedral in Jerusalem.

Our purpose for this trip is threefold; to discover the Biblical sites and so have a deeper understanding of the various events recorded within; to serve the local Christians by lifting Jesus high among them; and to be encouraged by connecting with other brothers and sisters around the world.
