Mones Says...

What an adventure we have been on this week. Nine of us travelled to the 25th anniversary celebration Revival Conference in Toronto. Surrounded by 3000 other hungry people from all around the world, believe me when I say, people came hungry for the presence of God.

A lot of people ask "where is the fruit of this revival?" For a revival to be such a thing there needs to be fruit, let me list a few examples:

1. Unity. When you have a Catholic Priest stand on platform and share what God has done in them and through them and how He is using them today as a result of their encounter with Him through this revival, your heart gets excited. Fruit number 1, unity.
2. Ministries restored. When you have pastors from every corner of the world come, and keep on coming, for twelve and half years of continuous daily meetings, and since then, for regular meetings and conferences. It's not that they came that is key, but rather the way they went back. You see, so many came burnt out, hurt, despondent and went back more excited about their faith and walk with God than about their ministries and so their ministries were revived, renewed, refreshed and became more about Father, Son and Holy Spirit than being about them.
3. New church movements sprang up. 33 new churches are in existence, spreading a fresh way of being a church which is a bride and a family, focused on His presence and His nearness, a tremendous focus that no one can fail to notice even after 10 minutes in being in the meetings.
4. Other ministries anointed and started. Iris Global, Heidi Baker's ministry, grew to 10000 churches, thousands of orphans cared for and blessed and millions coming to know Father through His amazing Son Jesus. Bill Johnson, of Bethel California, encountered God afresh, and he promised "Lord if you touch me again I will make all my ministry about honouring your presence," which he has been doing for over 18 years, with tremendous blessings to so many churches around the Globe. Partners in Harvest Network birthed, a network of 11000+ churches.
5. Hundreds of thousands of beloved sons and daughters of the King, received and continue to receive healing, transforming their lives and walks with God.

We ourselves, in my family, have received such a blessing and healing, growth and maturity in the Lord, and the courage to carry on in ministry. We became healed people, fell in love with scripture, discovered what it is to be loved by Father, Son and Holy Spirit, how to rest in The Lords presence and how to serve and love others.
